Meet your Elementary Principal...

It has been a very busy start to the school year. It was great to see our students and how much they changed in those few short months over the summer. We welcomed some new students and staff to our school. We certainly want anyone who is interested in our great school district, to come visit and check us out. We ask you to call the school and schedule a visit. If you plan to enroll a student, you need to pick up the required paperwork from our



front office, fill it out and return it prior (a day) to your student attending classes. This allows us to make sure we have a desk, books, and supplies in place to make sure the first day is very successful.

We have some changes in the start and end of some classrooms. PK - 12 the busses run in the morning and drop students off at school at 7:45. Students are allowed to enter the building at that

time for various morning routines. Hot breakfast is served till 8:15. Students may receive a grab and go breakfast after that time till 9:00. Our morning routines allow students to attend academic help, cultural activities, social skills lessons, and positive celebrations. The Early Learning Academy serves 3yr olds – K are out of school at 3:10. The rest of the elementary is out at 3:30 and will load the bus when it arrives back at school

Once again we are focusing on attendance and making sure our students are at school ready to learn. If your student is absent, please call the school and let us know the reason why they are absent.

Homecoming is next week starting Tuesday, Sept. 5<sup>th</sup>. Please look for additional information about the week's activities in the newsletter.

Hope you all had a great summer!!! A *Big Change* this year to the Health Office is that Steph Moose is now in the Health Office full-time as the Health Aide. I will continue to be here on Tuesdays and Thursdays and as needed.

**Thank-you** to those of you getting your **health forms and physical/eye exams turned in**!! All PK, Kindergarteners, 7<sup>th</sup> Graders and any student grades 7-12 that will play sports needs to have a physical completed. All PK and Kinders are also to have a yearly eye exam. We understand that the clinic has been very busy trying to get everyone worked in. Please just turn in physical/eye exam when you get them completed. *7-12<sup>th</sup> graders CANNOT participate in sports until the physical is complete and they are cleared by Doctor to play sports.* 

Hearing Screens will be on Sept 7<sup>th</sup> here at the school for all students. We will follow-up if there are any concerns that need to be addressed.

On a different note, we completed Head Checks in the elementary on Monday, August 21st. Over 80% of students in grades PK-6 had either Head Lice (live) or nits or both. We were unprepared for the number of students needing shampoo/treatment and I knew the clinic was unable to supply that amount of shampoo also. Shampoo should have been sent home with every PK-6 student over this last week. Please continue to check your child/children's hair and treat and remove nits as needed. If you are needing more shampoo/conditioner please let us know. We will continue to do weekly head checks on Mondays and Tuesdays (and as needed for rechecks) and send home shampoo. We are really needing parents/guardians to step up and do their part as this is too many for us to handle in the Health Office.



#### September is Suicide Prevention Awareness Month

September is Suicide Prevention Awareness Month. National Suicide Prevention week is September 10 – 16, 2017, beginning with World Suicide Prevention day on the 10th. Suicide is a very serious and very real problem with our youth. Spreading awareness is the first step to helping this problem.



In Nebraska....

- In Nebraska, suicide is the 1st leading cause of death for ages\*
- o 10 14 years & 2nd leading cause of death for ages 15 24 years\*

\*2015 Reports from Center for Disease Control

Warning signs that we look for in school.

- changes in school performance (e.g. grades, attendance)
- · changes in mood
- complaints of illness
- increased disciplinary problems at school
- problems experienced at home or family situations (stress, trauma, divorce, substance abuse, poverty, domestic violence)
- communication from teachers about problems at school
- · dealing with existing mental health concerns

Some warning signs may help you determine if a loved one is at risk for suicide, especially if the behavior is new, has increased, or seems related to a painful event, loss, or change.

- Eating or sleeping too much or too little
- Pulling away from people and things
- Having low or no energy
- Feeling numb or like nothing matters
- Having unexplained aches and pains
- Feeling helpless or hopeless
- Unable to perform daily tasks like taking care of your kids or getting to school or work

- Smoking, drinking, or using drugs
- Feeling unusually confused or forgetful; on edge, angry, or upset; or worried and scared
- Fighting with family and friends
- Unable to get ride of troubling thoughts and memories
- Thinking of hurting or killing yourself or someone else

#### MAP TESTING....

Students in the elementary and high school will soon be completing their NWEA MAP (Measure of Academic Progress) tests. Testing will begin on Monday, September 11 and continue through Friday, September 22. There are four academic areas tested: Math, Language, Reading and Science. When taking a MAP test, the difficulty of each question is based on how well a student answers all the previous questions. As the student answers correctly, questions become more difficult. If a student answers incorrectly, the questions become easier.

Parents please make sure that your child is well rested on school days and especially the day of a test. Children who are tired are less able to pay attention in class or handle the demands of a test.

#### Music Notes: Welcome back musicians!
